1. The Fairbanks School of Public Health will host a Grand Rounds on **Tuesday, October 4 at 12 noon** in Walther Hall Auditorium. Katie Wang, PhD, will discuss her research on "Living With Social Disadvantage: The Interpersonal Health Consequences of Stigma." Dr. Wang will explore the consequences of stigma on public health by demonstrating its effects on interpersonal interactions, sexual risk, and mental health among individuals with a wide range of stigmatized identities. The presentation will highlight the unique challenges faced by various stigmatized populations and the ways stigma can manifest. Additionally, the presentation will identify potential sources of resilience for stigmatized individuals and describe ways in which processes can be enhanced in health-promoting interventions geared to marginalized populations.

5. **Thomas Duszynski** will be hosting a panel discussion surrounding the HIV outbreak in Scott County Indiana. The panel will include **Dr. Joan Duwve** and members from the local health department and local physician's office in Austin, Indiana. The discussion will give an in-depth account of the outbreak from the perspective of those who live and work in that community as well as from those who responded. Dr. Nangel Lindberg will discuss, "Developing effective health promotion interventions for minority populations." This talk will focus on the development of a culture-centered behavioral intervention targeting diabetes risk management in Hispanic populations.
7. **Dr. Steven Lacey** spoke about the future of sensor technology in occupational hygiene practice this week in the High Level Leadership session at the 3rd Annual Worker Health Protection Conference, hosted by the British Occupational Hygiene Society in Abu Dhabi, UAE.
8. Congratulations to **Dennis Watson** and **Brad Ray** on the funding of their three year project, "Developing SUPPORT, a Community-Driven, Recovery-Oriented System of Care," by the National Institute on Drug Abuse. Join us in congratulating Dennis and Brad on this achievement!
9. **Jianjun Zhang** has been awarded an R21 grant (\$375,187 total) by the National Cancer Institute (NCI) of the National Institutes of Health (NIH). The primary objective of this project is to identify insulin resistance biomarkers and metabolomics signatures that are predictive of malignant intraductal papillary mucinous neoplasm (IPMN) of the pancreas (a type of pancreatic cysts). The expected results could inform physicians to make evidence-based clinical IPMN management and open new avenues for preventing this precursor lesion and ensuing pancreatic cancer. Dr. Zhang will conduct this project in collaboration with **Max Schmidt, MD, PhD, MBA (Co-PI)** and other investigators at Indiana University Fairbanks School of Public Health, Indiana University School of Medicine, and Massachusetts General Hospital. Join us in congratulating Jianjun on this achievement!
